Academic Credentials for Faculty, Graduate Teaching Assistants, and Other Teachers BU-PP 717

Policy Statement

Baylor University ("Baylor") employs competent faculty members and other teachers qualified to accomplish the mission and goals of the institution. When determining acceptable qualifications of its teachers, Baylor gives primary consideration to the highest earned degree in the discipline in accordance with this policy.

Reason for the Policy

Baylor University is accredited by the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association for Colleges and Schools (SACSCOC) to award bachelor's, master's, specialist, and doctor's degrees. The Commission has promulgated specific academic credential guidelines for faculty and program directors. Baylor University complies with those guidelines with regard to faculty as well as all other Teachers of Record.

Definitions

These definitions apply to terms as they are used in this policy.

Faculty	Includes full-time, part-time, and adjunct faculty. Administrators may also have a faculty appointment.
Staff	Employees of Baylor University who do not have a faculty appointment. This may include Administrators.
Teachers of Record	Primarily responsible for teaching course content and assigning grades.

Principles

When determining acceptable qualifications of its faculty and other teachers, Baylor gives primary consideration to the highest earned degree in the discipline in accordance with the guidelines listed below. (These guidelines were drawn from the SACSCOC Faculty Credentials Guidelines and Standard 6.2.a on Faculty Qualifications of the 2024 SACSCOC *Principles of Accreditation*.)

2. Academic Credentials for Faculty, Graduate Teaching Assistants, and Other Teachers (BU-PP 717)

Credential Guidelines

Faculty or Staff Teaching Baccalaureate Courses: doctorate or master's degree in the teaching discipline or master's degree with a concentration in the teaching discipline (minimum of 18 graduate semester hours in the teaching discipline).

Faculty or Staff Teaching Graduate and Post-Baccalaureate Course Work: earned doctorate/terminal degree in the teaching discipline or a related discipline.

Graduate Teaching Assistants: master's in the teaching discipline or 18 graduate semester hours in the teaching discipline, direct supervision by a faculty member experienced in the teaching discipline, regular in-service training, and planned and periodic evaluations.

Baylor also considers competence, effectiveness, and capacity, including, as appropriate, undergraduate and graduate degrees, related work experiences in the field, professional licensure and certifications, honors and awards, continuous documented excellence in teaching, or other demonstrated competencies and achievements that contribute to effective teaching and student learning outcomes. Thus, a faculty member or other teacher not meeting the specific degree guidelines could still be qualified by these additional criteria. For all cases, Baylor is responsible for justifying and documenting the qualifications of its teachers.

Baylor Requirements for Documentation of Credentials

Faculty and Staff: Current and new faculty members are required to submit to the Provost's Office information related to their qualifications, including transcripts and vitas, and to correct any errors that may appear in records maintained by Baylor University, such as incorrect information about degrees or degree-granting institutions. This information supplements the Faculty Certification of Credentials Form approved by the department chair and dean's office for the instructor's assigned courses.

Graduate Teaching Assistants: Graduate teaching assistants are required to provide information related to their qualifications, including transcripts and vitas or resumes, and to correct any errors that may appear in records maintained by Baylor University, such as incorrect information about degrees or degree-granting institutions. The qualifications of Graduate Teaching Assistants will be documented according to procedures established by the Graduate School.

Exemptions

Baylor maintains a list of approved exemption courses that have accepted alternate qualifications requirements due to the nature of the course being skills-based. This list includes activity courses (Lifetime Fitness), HED 1145 Health and Human Behavior, co-requisite labs, and music lessons.
